CALL TO ORDER – The meeting was called to order by Council President Adam Gigous at 6:38 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE - ROLL CALL

After the Pledge of Allegiance, roll call was taken. The following members were present Adam Gigous, Richard Yarrington, John Glynn, Mitchell Koel, Lamont Kiefer and Dean Peterson (remote) and Nellie Pater (arrived at 6:43 PM). Absent: Shawn Zabinski and Mike Murray. Quorum present. Also present was City Administrator Brad Hanson, City Attorney Penny Precour, Public Safety/Fire Chief Tim Adler, and City Clerk Becki Weyer.

PUBLIC HEARINGS:

1. Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Public Facilities (PF) Public Hearing for the Emergency Services Building at 815 N Superior Ave

The public hearing began at 6:38 p.m. due to lack of a quorum until that time. Administrator Hanson introduced the program to the Council and participants.

- i. Identification of total potential funds for matching funds: CDBG grant, property taxes, (1/2 of what will be reimbursed by the Ambulance Service) and bonding.
- ii. Eligible CDBG activities Jon Strand from CBS Squared appeared to describe the process of the CDBG and the eligible activities. CDBG has housing funds available, planning funds available, public facilities funds, economic development funds, and public facilities for public development (city infrastructure). The City may be eligible for some of these funds.
- iii. Presentation of identified community development needs Strand communicated that the New Public Safety building has been identified by the City as a potential cost that would fit into the program. Alderman Kiefer, who is a member of the CDBG and Tomah Housing Authority shared that the City of Tomah needs more low-to-moderate income housing, which could be another potential CDBG application opportunity.
- iv. Identification of any community development needs by public –No members of the public appeared via Zoom or in-person to add to the conversation.
- v. Presentation of activities proposed for CDBG application, including potential residential displacement. Strand referred to the 815 N Superior Ave proposed land site for the Public Safety Building, which has excellent transportation access to all parts of the City and all of its citizens. The CDBG application will only refer to those areas of the proposed Public Safety building that will be utilized by the Tomah Fire Department and percentages of the parts of the building that are shared between the Ambulance department and Fire Department. Other building components that could qualify for the grant application could be building constructions, utilities, parking areas, and restoration of seeding and landscaping. Council asked about the one unit on the property for potential displacement. Information was sent to those affected including those with property on the potential land site in accordance with grant application procedures.
- vi. Citizen input regarding proposed and other CDBG activities no member of the public appeared to comment or give input on the proposed or other CDBG activities. Council President Gigous asked if there were any additional concerns or questions by the public either online or in-person on three separate occasions.

Motion by Yarrington, second by Glynn to close the public hearing. Motion carried. Public Hearing for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Public Facilities (PF) Public Hearing for the Emergency Services Building at 815 N Superior Ave closed at 6:55 p.m.

RESOLUTION TO ADOPT A FAIR HOUSING ORDINANCE RESOLUTION No: 2021-05-04-17

AN ORDINANCE TO CREATE ARTICLE VI OF CHAPTER 12 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF TOMAH CODE OF ORDINANCES ADOPTING WISCONSIN STATUTES, SECTION 106.50, AS AMENDED, RELATING TO THE EQUAL RIGHTS OF ALL PERSONS TO FAIR HOUSING, AND PROVIDING MEANS FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION AND ENFORCEMENT THEREOF.

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TOMAH DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Article VI of Chapter 12 of the City of Tomah Code of Ordinances shall be created to incorporate the following:

FAIR AND OPEN HOUSING

WHEREAS, the City of Tomah recognizes its responsibilities under Section 106.50, Wisconsin Statutes, as amended, and endorses the concepts of fair and open housing for all persons and prohibition of discrimination therein;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED THAT the following statements shall be incorporated into Chapter 12 of the City of Tomah Code of Ordinances as Article VI, Sections 12-120 through 12-122 respectively:

- 1) The City of Tomah hereby adopts Section 106.50, Wisconsin Statutes, as amended, and all subsequent amendments thereto.
- 2) The officials and employees of the City of Tomah shall assist in the orderly prevention and removal of all discrimination in housing within the City municipal jurisdiction by implementing the authority and enforcement procedures set forth in Section 106.50, Wisconsin Statutes, as amended.

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3) The Municipal Clerk shall maintain forms for complaints to be filed under Section 106.50, Wisconsin Statutes, as amended, and shall assist any person alleging a violation thereof in the City of Tomah to file a complaint thereunder with the Wisconsin Department of Work Force Development, Equal Rights Division, for enforcement of Section 106.50, Wisconsin Statutes, as amended

After deliberation by the council and recommendations from Atty. Precour, the Council agreed that the following steps taken should be indicated on the Wisconsin Residential Anti-Displacement and Relocation Assistance Plan: Coordinate code enforcement with rehabilitation and housing assistance programs, Stage rehabilitation of apartment units to allow tenants to remain in the building/complex during and after the rehabilitation, working with empty units first, and target only those properties deemed essential to the need or success of the project.

> POLICY TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF EXCESSIVE FORCE AND TO ENFORCE APPLICABLE STATE AND LOCAL LAWS PROHIBITING PHYSICALLY BARRING ENTRANCES/EXITS FOR NON-VIOLENT CIVIL RIGHTS DEMONSTRATIONS

RESOLUTION NO. 2021-05-04-18

A resolution of the City Council of the City of Tomah, to adopt the policy to prohibit the use of excessive force and to enforce applicable state and local laws prohibiting physically barring entrances/exits for non-violent civil rights demonstrations:

WHEREAS Section 104 (L)(1) of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 as amended (42 U.S.C. 69 \$5304) prohibits the State from expending or obligating any Community Development Block Grant funds to any unit of general local government that does not have or adopt a policy prohibiting the use of excessive force by local law enforcement agencies within its jurisdiction against any individuals engaged in nonviolent civil rights demonstrations; and a policy of enforcing State and local laws against physically barring entrance to or exit from a facility or location which is the subject of such nonviolent civil rights demonstration within its jurisdiction:

AND WHEREAS it is in the interest of the City of Tomah to pursue Community Development Block Grant Funds and to adopt policy that complies with Section 104 (L)(1) of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 as amended (42 USC 69 §5304) NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TOMAH:

I. It is POLICY of the City of Tomah to prohibit the use of excessive force by law enforcement agencies within the City's jurisdiction against any individuals engaged in nonviolent civil rights demonstrations.

II. It is POLICY of the City of Tomah to enforce applicable State and local laws

against physically barring entrance to or exit from a facility or location which is the subject of such nonviolent civil rights demonstration within the City's iurisdiction.

III. The officials and employees of the City shall assist in the orderly prevention of all excessive force within the City of Tomah by implementing the authority and enforcement procedures set forth in Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974.

IV. The City Council directs the Police Chief to implement this Resolution by amending applicable Tomah Police Department procedure

WHEREAS, the City of Tomah, Monroe County, Wisconsin (the "Issuer") plans to undertake the projects listed in Exhibit A attached hereto (collectively, the "Project"); WHEREAS, the Issuer expects to eventually finance the Project with tax-exempt bonds or notes (the "Obligations");

WHEREAS, because the Obligations will not be issued prior to commencement of the Project, the Issuer must provide interim financing to cover costs of the Project incurred prior to receipt of the proceeds of the Obligations; and WHEREAS, the Common Council (the "Governing Body") of the Issuer deems it to be

necessary, desirable, and in the best interests of the Issuer to advance moneys from its funds on hand on an interim basis to pay the costs of the Project until the Obligations are issued. **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Governing Body of the Issuer that: Section 1. Expenditure of Funds. The Issuer shall make expenditures as needed from its funds on hand to pay the cost of the Project until proceeds of the Obligations become

Section 2. Declaration of Official Intent. The Issuer hereby officially declares its

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intent under Treas. Reg. Section 1.150-2 to reimburse said expenditures with proceeds of the Obligations, the principal amount of which is not expected to exceed, on aggregate, \$14,100,000. Section 3. Unavailability of Long-Term Funds. No funds for payment of the Project from sources other than the Obligations are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside by the Issuer pursuant to its budget or financial policies.

Section 4. Public Availability of Official Intent Resolution. The Resolution shall be made available for public inspection at the office of the Issuer's Clerk within 30 days after its approval in compliance with applicable State law governing the availability of records of official acts including Subchapter II of Chapter 19, and shall remain available for public inspection until

the Obligations are issued.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Resolution shall be effective upon its adoption and approval.
