TID funds were distributed to 3rd Gen, LLC and is in process for the Veterans Assistance Foundation and the Doogie's Doggie Daycare. 3. Demolition is complete on the house behind the Gerke building. 4. A needs assessment survey may be done to determine whether a traffic roundabout is necessary in the City.
